HEIFER RANCH MOO-VING ALONG JUNE 15-20

Our date for the Heifer Ranch mission trip is June 15-20. Based on the available dates at the ranch, it had to be set either that week, or the first week of June (but we might still be in school then:-() or fair week (and I guess you know THAT wouldn't work out!).

Please see the enclosed flyer for details on the trip, which is called Summer Action. We will enjoy a 12-hour drive to Arkansas, just outside of Little Rock (if you thought Croton was out of the way, wait until you see Perryville). We arrive at Heifer Ranch at 7 pm on Sunday and finish up at 10 am on Friday.

We will spend four nights in a lodge, and one night at the Global Village. We'll have a chance to learn a lot about world hunger in a busy and active environment, including high and low ropes courses, and we will do service projects



at the ranch. We'll also learn how to make the most of the resources we have. You can look up more details about our experience and see some videos about what we'll be doing at www.heifer.org. This is going to be way better than spending the week at the mall or in front of the TV!

I need to know AS SOON AS POSSI-BLE if you are going. The cost of the trip is \$335 per person plus travel expenses. We are hoping that fundraising will cover most (or all) of the fee. Please let me know by March 31 if you will be going. Friends are welcome to sign up, at the same cost and must also make a commitment by March 31.

Interested adults are welcome to come with us (the cost is the same). I have tentatively told Heifer that we will have 10 people, but we can take up to 17 people.

SUMMER MUSIC FESTIVALS

We have some decisions to make if we want to go to a summer Christian music festival! There are several available that combine camping and music and other fun events. We would see groups such as Casting Crowns, toby-Mac, Jeremy Camp, David Crowder, Kutless, Skillet, Hawk Nelson, Family Force 5, Leeland, Grits, and Stellar Kart.

Here's the schedule for these events: Ichthus: June 11-14, Wilmore, KY Alive '08: June 18-21, Canal Fulton, OH Creation Fest: June 25-28,

Mount Union, PA

Unfortunately, Alive '08 falls during the Heifer Ranch trip, so we can't go to that one this year. Ichthus begins during Annual Conference, which creates conflicts for some of the adult leaders (mainly me and maybe Charles, if he wants to go to both) and some of their kids (Patrick, Erin and Jenna). Ichthus also ends right before we leave for Heifer Ranch. Creation Fest is the farthest away (about 5 hours from here). Also, they are all in June, which is going

to be a busy month already. So, it is very important that you look at your June schedule and let us know what you'd like to do. Anybody know of any held in July?

If we go to a festival, we will probably need additional adult chaperones, so, especially if your parents like camping (or Christian music), ask them if they'd like to come along!

Cost of tickets to these festivals is about \$100. Ichthus only charges \$20 plus a refundable \$25 deposit to volunteers who work a 9-hour shift during the festival.

Summer Action

Service participants engage in a journey of personal growth. They commit to the value of serving others through interactive learning, community building and work projects. Participants connect with a community that is actively working to end hunger and poverty while caring for the earth.

Activities include:

Global Gateway - During this overnight activity, participants will explore their cultural identity and discuss similarities within the global community while examining issues of population, resource distribution, quality of life and standard of living. They will engage as a group in a series of initiative games to develop their communication and problemsolving skills, prepare their own dinner and breakfast, and participate in daily chores similar to those our project partners do each day.

Heifer Challenge - Challengers increase their awareness of environmental and hunger related issues through the use of globally themed team-building initiatives and challenges that provide an emotionally safe environment to encourage reflection and self growth. This program includes both low and high elements.

Sign-up Activities - Sign-up activities include service projects and additional education programs. Service projects include helping with general Ranch chores, gardening, working with livestock, composting, and other Ranch projects. Additional education programs involve hands-on activities that teach more about Heifer International's mission and how the participants can make a difference.

Summer Action Program Requirements

Minimum Age: 12 years old or completed the 6th grade Minimum Group Size: 10 participants including adults

Adult to Youth Ratio: 1:5

Per Person Tuition Fees: \$335 (Non-profit Rate) **Tuition Fees Include:** lodging, programming and meals

Offered: June - mid-August; program begins at 7 p.m. and continues until 10 a.m. on the

day of departure
